

## MPI Tech Statement on Conflict Minerals

MPI Tech is committed to social responsibility. We are aware of and concerned by reports that profit from the sale of certain metals mined in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries have helped fuel war and human rights violations in the eastern Congo.

MPI Tech supports the goals and objectives of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act\*, which aims to prevent the use of conflict minerals that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in The Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or an adjoining country as defined in the Act (Conflict Region).

MPI Tech subcontractors use some of these materials in the manufacturing of its products as they are required for the functional performance of the products. MPI Tech does not purchase these metals directly from smelters or mines, nor its contractors. Therefore we must rely on the source information provided by our suppliers.

MPI Tech has obtained information from suppliers concerning the origin of the metals that are used in the manufacture of MPI Tech products. Based upon information provided by our suppliers, MPI Tech does not use metals derived from the Conflict Region.

\* Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act imposes new supply chain reporting requirements on U.S. publicly traded companies to promote transparency and consumer awareness regarding the use of "conflict minerals" (tantalum, tin, gold and tungsten, or "3TG") that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in that region. The Act requires companies to perform due diligence with respect to the sourcing of conflict minerals and to file annual reports relating to use of conflict minerals.
